2025 Lewis University Department of Education Educationis Lumen Award

On Tuesday, October 22, **Gabriela Lopez-Semanjaku (Elementary Education,'19)** was surprised by Lewis' Dr. Hyeseong Lee and Dean of Education, Dr. Elizabeth Sturm with the news that she is being awarded the 40th annual Educationis Lumen Award.

Mrs. Lopez-Semanjaku teaches kindergarten at Juliette Low Elementary School in CCSD59, Arlington Heights and the school's principal, Lily Smith '02, is also a Lewis alumna (Elementary Education) and former member of the Lewis Women's Soccer team.

In her nomination letter, Principal Smith stated, "Gabi actively builds partnerships with families, ensuring that parents have meaningful access to their children's education regardless of language barriers. This inclusive approach reflects the Christian principle of serving others selflessly and breaking down barriers that might prevent families from fully participating in their children's educational journey." The award will be formally presented at the November 6<sup>th</sup> Lewis Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi *National Professional Association and Honor Society for Educators* Initiation Ceremony.

The **Educationis Lumen Award**, established in 1985, is presented annually by the Department of Education at Lewis University to one Lewis alumnus/alumna based upon the individual's accomplishments as a professional educator. The criteria for selection include:

- Evidence of excellence in teaching
- Commitment to the finest Christian ideals of education
- Dedication to the teaching profession
